# National Association Football League First Season Game Summaries

Game summaries for season one of the National Association Football League were compiled from multiple newspaper sources. Individual newspaper summaries were often incomplete and commonly contained erroneous spellings of player names, etc., but when numerous summaries from different papers were taken as a group, a cohesive summary could normally be constructed. When conflicts arose, the newspaper of the home team or the summary with the most detail was normally taken as the most definitive source. As such, the player names listed below may differ from individual newspaper accounts. Refer to the detailed game descriptions for references to source material.

#### Week 13 - May 26, 1895

Game 1: Newark Scottish-Americans and Brooklyn Wanderers at Wiedenmayer's Park in Newark, NJ. In a controversial contest, Brooklyn defeated Newark by either 8-4 (*Newark Daily Advertiser*) or 8-5 (*Newark Evening News*). The *Newark Daily Advertiser* listed the scorers as Gemmill, Brown, Hopkins, Mason (2), Young (2), and Hill for the Wanderers, and Wallace and McGee each with a brace for the Scots. Lineups for the match are not available. The *Newark Evening News* reported that the contest was delayed by a baseball game and several of the Scots' best players left Wiedenmayer's Park before the game began. The Wanderers were prepared to play and the Scots played several substitutes in what they thought was an exhibition game. No newspaper accounts exist to shed light on the eventual outcome, but it appears the Wanderers were awarded the contest.

Game 2: Bayonne Centreville AC and Americus AA of West Hoboken, NJ, in Bayonne, NJ. Americus AA failed to appear for the contest and the game was awarded to Centreville AC.

#### Week 14 – June 2, 1895

Game 1:Victory by Americus, although the score is not known. Winner implied from final won/lost records.

Game 2: Bayonne Centreville AC vs. Newark Scottish-Americans in Bayonne, NJ. Victory by Centreville AC due to Scottish-American forfeit.
