Season 1 Scoring Leaders

The scoring leaders for the inaugural NAFL season are listed in the following table. Unfortunately, the number of goals attributed to "Unknown" is significant enough to make it impossible to accurately determine the high scorer. What can be gleaned from the top scorers list is the dominance of the Centreville front line consisting of John Coupar, John Grundy, Frederick Oliver, George Spaven, and James Campbell, who accounted for at least 48 goals. The consistency of this group was a key to their success. Being together for most of the season, Centreville enjoyed a distinct advantage over clubs fielding a different front five every few weeks.
