

WHAT HAPPENED TO COLOMBIA?

In recent years Colombia's achievement record has been quite impressive (ITALIA '90, WYC '89, U-17 '89), and they came to Barcelona in the hope of confirming their status and still being involved in the tournament when it came to battling for the medals. In the event they managed only one point from three games, and afterwards team officials spoke of the tournament as one of Colombian football's biggest disappointments for a long time.

Their opening game against Spain was a disaster in two respects. First, the players totally lost their self-control and Spain ruthlessly exploited this weakness, scoring four goals with no reply. Second, Colombian players saw two red and six yellow cards, in a match full of interruptions and an effective playing time of only 44 minutes. This result severely compromised their chances of further progress in the tournament, and they did not manage to turn the tide, earning only a draw against Qatar (with a missed penalty) and then suffering the embarrassment of losing 3-4 against Egypt having been 3-2 ahead only seven minutes from time. The Colombian association will certainly want to analyse the events in Barcelona very carefully before making any decision about the future of this team. The potential is certainly available, as they demonstrated in the first half hour against Egypt, whom they completely dominated as they built up a 2-0 lead. Also their results and performances in the qualifying games, where they held their own against Brazil and Uruguay, certainly indicate that talent is available.

A technical/tactical analysis is not a simple matter in this case. The knowledge that this team certainly could have done much better makes it hard to understand why they allowed their own lack of discipline to prevent them from reaping the rewards of their efforts. The continuity of development in Colombian football is clear from the fact that no less than 12 of this squad had played in earlier FIFA competitions. Some of the players on view in Barcelona will definitely find regular places in future national sides, the more certainly since the Olympic team is currently the association's most prestigious selection. We can only hope that these recent disappointments will not adversely affect development, since the obvious talent of many of these players indicates a promising future.

Tactically the Colombians used a 4-4-2 system with libero Bermudez playing in line with his defensive colleagues. Bermudez, plus midfielders Gavira (top scorer with 2 goals) and Pacheco, and star forward Asprilla (recently transferred to AC Parma in Italy) were the team's outstanding players. Vallenciano, the other highly-promising striker, also on his way to Italy where he will play for Atalanta Bergamo, found that his Olympic tournament lasted exactly 18 minutes: he was sent off after allowing himself to be drawn into a revenge foul.

There is no doubt that the Colombians were a disappointment. It is to be hoped that the team officials and the players themselves will draw the right conclusions from their unfortunate experiences to get the development of football in their country back on the right track and help it along with increased intensity.

La Colombie espérait pouvoir confirmer à Barcelone ses précédents résultats (ITALIA '90, CMJ '89, U-17 '89) et pouvoir ainsi participer à la lutte pour les médailles. Elle est repartie avec un seul point en trois matches. Ce qui a fait dire aux responsables de l'équipe que le football colombien avait connu là l'une des plus grosses déceptions de son histoire.

Le premier match contre l'Espagne fut un désastre total. Les joueurs ont perdu le contrôle de leurs nerfs et l'Espagne n'a pas manqué de profiter des chances qui lui étaient offertes. Deux cartons rouges, six cartons jaunes et quatre buts encaissés dans un match dont la durée de jeu effective ne fut que de 44 minutes: le bilan était catastrophique et il compromettait sérieusement l'avenir de l'équipe colombienne dans le tournoi. Cette déconvenue initiale a été suivie d'un pauvre match nul contre le Qatar (un penalty manqué) et d'une nouvelle défaite contre l'Egypte (3-4), alors que la Colombie menait encore par 3-2 à sept minutes de la fin. Les responsables de la Fédération vont analyser les raisons de cet échec et prendre, dans le calme, les décisions nécessaires quant à l'avenir de cette sélection. Un potentiel existe. On en a eu la preuve dans la première demi-heure du match contre l'Egypte. La Colombie a alors nettement dominé et elle s'est assuré deux buts d'avance. La sélection avait auparavant déjà démontré sa valeur dans les matches de qualification (victoires sur le Brésil et l'Uruguay notamment).

Une analyse technique/tactique n'est pas facile. Il est indiscutable que l'équipe avait les moyens de faire beaucoup mieux et que l'indiscipline de certains joueurs a ruiné bien des espoirs. Le travail en profondeur à travers les sélections de juniors a porté ses fruits. On ne comptait pas moins de douze joueurs ayant participé précédemment à des compétitions de la FIFA pour les jeunes. Plusieurs des joueurs présents à Barcelone devraient se retrouver dans le cadre de l'équipe nationale, et ce d'autant plus que l'équipe olympique constitue présentement la principale des sélections de la Fédération. Il reste à espérer que ce qui s'est passé à Barcelone ne viendra pas perturber le travail effectué jusqu'ici car quelques joueurs ont indiscutablement du talent.

Tactiquement, la Colombie a joué en 4-4-2. Les éléments les plus en vue furent le libero Bermudez, qui évoluait sur la même ligne que les autres défenseurs, le milieu de terrain Gavira (meilleur buteur avec deux réalisations) et Pacheco, ainsi que l'attaquant Aprilia, qui s'en est allé poursuivre sa carrière en Italie, à l'AC Parma. Pour Vallenciano, l'attaquant vedette, transféré à l'Atalanta Bergame, le tournoi olympique n'a duré que 18 minutes. Il a été expulsé pour une agression.

Le Colombie fut une déception, cela ne se discute pas. Il faut souhaiter que dirigeants et joueurs sachent tirer la leçon de ce qui s'est passé en Espagne et que le développement du football en Colombie ne subira aucun coup d'arrêt et qu'au contraire même, le travail dans la continuité se poursuivra avec une plus grande intensité encore.

La delegación colombiana que viajó a Barcelona'92 con la esperanza de ver confirmado su gran progreso en el sector futbolístico (ITALIA'90, CMU'89, Sub-17 '89) con una medalla en los JJ.OO., tuvo que regresar a casa con un único punto contabilizado en tres partidos. Después del Torneo, los funcionarios de la selección titularon esta presentación como una de las decepciones más grandes del fútbol colombiano en los últimos años.

El primer partido contra España fue un desastre por dos razones principales: primero, porque los jugadores colombianos perdieron completamente el dominio de sí mismos y, segundo, porque España aprovechó todas las posibilidades con una frialdad despiadada. Dos tarjetas rojas y seis amarillas así como cuatro goles encajados fueron el infierno saldo de este choque que duró únicamente 44 minutos de juego efectivo. Con este resultado, los sudamericanos se encontraban ya de entrada en una posición sumamente desventajosa.

Un magro empate contra Qatar (con un penal fallado) y una derrota embarazosa (3-4) contra Egipto, tras ir ganado por 3 a 2 a siete minutos del término, fueron los restantes resultados de los colombianos. La dirección de la asociación colombiana tendrá que analizar exactamente los acontecimientos de Barcelona'92 y reflexionar detenidamente sobre el futuro de esta selección. Sin duda alguna, el equipo dispone de un gran potencial, lo cual se vislumbró brevemente en los primeros 30 minutos del enfrentamiento con Egipto, en el cual los colombianos dominaron claramente, pasando al frente con dos goles. Igualmente los resultados y el rendimiento exhibidos en los partidos clasificatorios, donde se eliminó a Brasil y Uruguay, demuestran que el equipo cuenta con algunos talentos.

Es muy difícil efectuar un análisis técnico/táctico de esta escuadra. A sabiendas de que la selección colombiana podría haber rendido mucho más, resulta incomprensible que se haya privado ella misma del fruto de sus esfuerzos por su actuar indisciplinado y antideportivo. La continuidad del desarrollo en el sector juvenil parece funcionar bien, hecho que fue confirmado por la presencia de nada menos que 12 jugadores que habían actuado ya en competiciones juveniles precedentes de la FIFA. Algunos de los protagonistas en Barcelona'92 formarán seguramente parte de la selección nacional de adultos, tanto más que la selección olímpica es considerada momentáneamente el equipo más importante de la asociación. Esperemos que la decepcionante presentación en España no influya en esta labor de desarrollo, ya que el talento evidenciado por varios jugadores hace que el futuro sea prometedor.

El planteo táctico colombiano era un sistema 4-4-2, con el libero Bermudez que jugaba en una línea con sus compañeros de defensa. En la línea media se destacaron

Gaviria (con dos goles, mejor ariete colombiano) y Pacheco, así como el delantero Asprilla, recientemente transferido al AC Parma.

Para el atacante estrella Vallenciano, fichado por el Atalanta Bergamo, el Torneo Olímpico duró únicamente 18 minutos. Fue expulsado tras agredir violentamente a un adversario.

La actuación de la escuadra colombiana fue una gran decepción. Queda por desechar que los jugadores y funcionarios sean capaces de sacar las conclusiones correctas de esta mala experiencia y que continúen fomentando con mayor intensidad el desarrollo tan prometedor en el fútbol en Colombia.

Mit der Hoffnung auf Bestätigung der in Kolumbien vorangeschrittenen Entwicklung (ITALIA '90, WYC '89, U-17 '89) nach Barcelona geriet, um im Kampf um die Medaillen mithalten zu können, musste das kolumbianische Team mit nur einem Punkt aus drei Spielen nach Hause reisen. Die Teamverantwortlichen sprachen nach dem Turnier auch von einer der größten Enttäuschungen, die der kolumbianische Fussball in den vergangenen Jahren erlebt hatte.

Das erste Spiel gegen Spanien wurde aus zweierlei Hinsicht zum totalen Desaster. Die Spieler verloren ihre Selbstkontrolle komplett und Spanien nutzte die ihnen gebotenen Chancen gnadenlos aus. Zwei rote und sechs gelbe Karten, plus vier Verlusttore waren die brutale Ausbeute dieser mit einer effektiven Spielzeit von nur 44 Minuten dauernden Partie. Damit waren die Chancen der Südamerikaner bereits arg kompromittiert; ein mageres Unentschieden gegen Katar (mit einem vergebenen Elfmeter) und eine peinliche 3:4-Niederlage gegen Ägypten, nachdem man sieben Minuten vor Schluss noch 3:2 geführt hatte, waren die restlichen Resultate der Kolumbianer. Die Verbandsführung wird die Gründe der Vorkommisse in Barcelona genau analysieren und sich in Ruhe über die weitere Entwicklung dieser Mannschaft Gedanken machen müssen.

Das Potential ist eindeutig vorhanden. Dies zeigten starke Szenen in den ersten 30 Minuten gegen Ägypten auf, als Kolumbien seinen Gegner klar dominierte und mit 2:0 in Führung gehen konnte. Auch die Ergebnisse und Leistungen in den Qualifikationsspielen, wo Brasilien und Uruguay in Schach gehalten werden konnten, zeugen vom Talent, das in diesem Team steckt. Eine technisch/taktische Analyse fällt nicht leicht. Im Wissen, dass die Mannschaft viel besser hätte abschneiden müssen ist es schwer verständlich, dass sie sich mit ihrer Undiszipliniertheit selbst um die Früchte ihrer Anstrengungen brachte.

Die Kontinuität in Bezug auf die Entwicklung im Juniorenbereich scheint zu stimmen, was die Tatsache beweist, dass nicht weniger als 12 Spieler an früheren FIFA-Jugendkompetitionen teilgenommen haben. Einige der in Barcelona präsenten Akteure werden sicherlich zum Stamm der Nationalmannschaft gehören, umso mehr als die Olympiamannschaft momentan die wichtigste Auswahl des Verbandes darstellt. Wir hoffen, dass das enttäuschen Abschneiden in Barcelona diese Entwicklungsarbeit nicht beeinträchtigen wird, denn das bei vielen Spielern festgestellte Talent lässt Gutes für die Zukunft hoffen.

Taktisch spielte Kolumbien mit einem 4-4-2-System mit dem auf einer Linie mit seinen Abwehrkollegen spielenden Libero Bermudez, den Mittelfeldspielern Gavira (mit zwei Toren bester kolumbianischer Torschütze) und Pacheco sowie dem neu zur AC Parma transferierten Stürmer-As Asprilla als herausragende Akteure.

Für Stürmerstar Vallenciano, zu Atalanta Bergamo transfiert, dauerte der Wettbewerb ganze 18 Minuten; er wurde vom Platz gestellt, nachdem er sich zu einer Tälichkeit hinreissen ließ.

Kolumbien war eine Enttäuschung, das ist eine ganz klare Tatsache. Den Teamverantwortlichen und Spielern können wir nur wünschen, dass aus den schlechten Erfahrungen die richtigen Schlüsse gezogen werden und die vielversprechende Entwicklung des Fussballs in Kolumbien mit noch vermehrter Intensität fortgesetzt wird.

MOROCCO – TOO LONG ON THE ROAD

Morocco had eliminated the strong Cameroon team in the qualifying tournament and German-born coach Werner Olk brought 6 players to Barcelona who had also participated in the African Cup of Nations in Senegal in January '92. As a result it was quite an experienced team that started in the matches in the Olympics following an intensive training period in Europe.

An opening draw against the Korea Republic was a promising start but two defeats against Sweden and Paraguay in which 7 goals were conceded resulted in a (very) early exit. The team featured some talented individual players who on occasion shared good speed and endurance but in the final analysis it was to individual mistakes and an inability to take advantage of goal-scoring opportunities that contributed to their overall poor performance. This was best exemplified in the final game against Paraguay when individual defensive mistakes contributed to the three goals conceded whilst at the other end of the field only one goal, in the final minute, was scored from 23 goal opportunities.

Tactically the team changed its formation from a 3-5-2 system to 4-4-2 and 4-3-3 systems as the situation demanded but often the team was unable to adapt to the play of the opposing teams, notably in the game against Sweden. Gap-defending which featured a sweeper and man-marking defenders was not always adequate and in this respect the support play from the midfield players was not often sufficient to provide some depth to the defence. The team tended to use a slow controlled build up in attack, utilising short passes and often a preference by individual players to dribble the ball into the midfield and attacking areas of the field.

This often led to a loss of possession and quick counter attacks by opponents but the area of the field where this was most noticeable was in the opposing team's penalty area. The game against Paraguay was notable for the number of occasions in which Morocco's attacking players got into excellent positions to shoot at goal but either passed to another teammate in the penalty area or waited too long with the resultant shot being blocked by defenders.

The team usually featured a line-up in defence with Achab in goal who, apart from a bad mistake in the game against Paraguay, performed quite capably, sweeper Bouhlal and central defenders Moudakkar and captain Naybet who was to score a fine goal with a header against Paraguay in the final game. El Hadrioui and Abrami played in the fullback positions and both operated in attacking positions when there was the opportunity. It was however the midfield area of the field that featured a wide range of players and this changed lineup probably contributed to some of the problems on the field. It was certainly to be a factor with regards to the support given to the attacking players usually El Badraoui, Samadi and Rokbi.

Ahmed Bahja also came on as a substitute on several occasions and in fact scored the only goal in the game against Korea Republic.

One factor that could have contributed to the disappointing performance of the Moroccan team could well have been the fact that they had to travel by road to Barcelona on two occasions during the tournament thus preventing the team from adequately preparing for upcoming games, since the overall journey usually took 9-10 hours. In the final analysis however this young team with undoubtedly potential can look back on Barcelona '92 as an excellent preparation experience of the upcoming qualification rounds for the 1994 World Cup.

Le Maroc s'était qualifié aux dépens de la redoutable équipe du Cameroun. Son entraîneur, l'Allemand Werner Olk, avait retenu pour Barcelone six joueurs ayant participé à la Coupe d'Afrique des nations, en janvier 1992 au Sénégal. C'est donc une équipe expérimentée qui entame ce tournoi olympique après une intense période de préparation en Europe.

Après un bon départ, avec un match nul contre la République de Corée, le Maroc a été battu tant par la Suède que par le Paraguay, encaissant sept buts en deux matches. D'où une élimination prématée. On trouvait dans l'équipe marocaine quelques individualités qui ont su faire valoir leur rapidité et leur endurance mais, dans l'ensemble, il y eut trop d'erreurs individuelles et, surtout, trop de lacunes à la finition pour que la sélection puisse prétendre à beaucoup mieux. Le troisième match contre le Paraguay constitue le meilleur des exemples à ce sujet: trois erreurs de la défense ont permis aux Paraguayens de marquer à trois reprises cependant que, de l'autre côté, le Maroc n'a pu transformer, à la dernière minute, qu'une seule de ses vingt-trois occasions de but.

Sur le plan tactique, le 3-5-2 s'est transformé en 4-4-2 ou en 4-3-3 selon les circonstances. L'équipe a toutefois éprouvé des difficultés à s'organiser en fonction de l'adversaire. Ce fut le cas contre la Suède notamment. La défense, avec son marquage individuel et un «balayeur», n'a pas brillé par son organisation et le soutien de son milieu de terrain lui fit trop souvent défaut. Sur le plan offensif, on tenta de construire posément ses actions à l'aide de passes courtes mais les dribblings superflus amenèrent des pertes du ballon et facilitèrent les mouvements de rupture adverses. Mais c'est devant les buts adverses que les problèmes ne furent pas résolus. Dans le match contre le Paraguay, les attaquants marocains se créèrent nombre d'occasions. Bien qu'en bonne position, ils n'osèrent cependant pas prendre de risques, préférant la passe à un coéquipier ou temporisant avant d'armer enfin leur tir.

Devant le gardien Mustapha Achab, qui n'a commis qu'une erreur, contre le Paraguay, la défense a évolué avec l'arrière libre Mouhcine Bouhlal et les arrières centraux Mouloud Moudakkar et le capitaine Noureddine Naybet, auteur, de la tête, du but contre le Paraguay. Les latéraux Abdellah El Hadrioui et Lahcen Abrami tentèrent tous deux des montées sur les ailes quand les circonstances le permettaient. En milieu de terrain, les changements furent constants et ils furent certainement à l'origine de plusieurs problèmes, comme le manque de soutien apporté aux attaquants, Mohamed El Badraoui, Mohamed Samadi et Said Rokbi. Ahmed Bahja est entré en cours de partie en plusieurs occasions et il s'est fait l'auteur du but contre la République de Corée.

L'un des facteurs qui explique peut-être la contre-performance marocaine est le fait qu'à deux reprises, l'équipe a dû effectuer des déplacements par la route, ce qui a écourté son temps de récupération. Il n'est reste pas moins que cette jeune sélection a démontré un potentiel indis-

cutable et que Barcelone '92 a sans doute constitué pour elle une excellente expérience en vue du tour préliminaire de la Coupe du monde 1994.

Marruecos eliminó a la potente escuadra de Camerún en el torneo de clasificación. El entrenador alemán, Werner Olk, llevó a Barcelona '92 a seis jugadores que habían participado en la Copa Africana de Naciones en Senegal en enero de 1992. Como resultado, pudo presentar un equipo sumamente experimentado que había cumplido un intensivo periodo de preparación en Europa antes de los Juegos Olímpicos.

El empate contra la Rep. de Corea en el primer partido fue un comienzo prometedor, pero las dos derrotas subsiguientes contra Suecia y Paraguay, en las cuales concedieron siete goles, significó su eliminación del Torneo. La selección marroquí dispuso de algunos talentosos jugadores, veloces y resistentes, pero en el análisis final se constató que su débil actuación se debió a errores individuales y a la incapacidad de los jugadores de materializar las oportunidades de gol.

Este hecho se mostró claramente en su último partido contra Paraguay, en el cual encajaron tres goles por errores individuales en la defensa y consiguieron marcar un único tanto en los últimos instantes del partido sobre un total de 23 oportunidades tenidas.

Desde el punto de vista del planteo táctico de su juego, la selección cambió su formación 3-5-2 a 4-4-2 y 4-3-3, según lo exigían las circunstancias, pero muchas veces fue incapaz de adaptarse al juego de sus oponentes, particularmente en la contienda contra Suecia. La marcación en zona con un barredor y varios marcadores que encimaban al hombre estrechamente no produjo la firmeza necesaria y el apoyo de los centrocampistas careció del acompañamiento requerido para dar profundidad a esta defensa.

El equipo africano tendió a armar su juego lento y pausadamente, sustentando en el control de la pelota y llevándola con gambetas individuales a través de la media cancha hasta la zona de ataque. Esto condujo, a menudo, a que fueran despojados del balón y que los adversarios armaran veloces contragolpes peligrosos. Donde más pecaron de este desmesurado jueguito de toques fue en el área penal contraria, como contra Paraguay, partido en el cual los delanteros marroquíes tuvieron un sinnúmero de oportunidades propicias para rematar al arco, pero las desecharon todas por efectuar siempre un toque más a algún compañero o por esperar demasiado, siendo el tiro tardío bloqueado luego por un defensa adversario.

Generalmente, el equipo salió a jugar con el mismo plantel, formado por Mustapha Achab en el arco, quien - aparte de un error garrafal en el encuentro con Paraguay - actuó bastante bien; el barredor Mouhcine Bouhlal y los defensores centrales Mouloud Moudakkar y el capitán Noureddine Naybet, quien anotó un estupendo gol de cabeza contra Paraguay. Abdelkrim El Hadrioui y Lahcen Abramí ocuparon las posiciones de zagueros laterales, sumándose a los despliegues ofensivos

cada vez que se daba la oportunidad. Fue en la línea media donde más variaron los jugadores y esta constante modificación de la formación condujo posiblemente a las insuficiencias en el medio campo. Sin duda alguna, fue uno de los factores que contribuyó igualmente al débil rendimiento de los delanteros Mohamed El Bedraoui, Mohamed Samadi y Said Rokbi, carentes del acompañamiento necesario de los centrocampistas.

Ahmed Bahja apareció varias veces como suplente y marcó el único gol en el choque con la Rep. de Corea.

Otro factor que podría haber contribuido a la mala actuación de la selección marroquí fue el hecho de que tuvieran que desplazarse en dos ocasiones a Barcelona por carretera, lo cual hizo que no pudieran prepararse adecuadamente para sus choques siguientes, ya que un viaje así tardaba generalmente 9 a 10 horas. En resumen, esta joven escuadra talentosa puede considerar Barcelona '92 como una excelente experiencia de preparación para el próximo torneo clasificatorio de la Copa Mundial 1994.

In der vom deutschen Werner Olk trainierten marokkanischen Mannschaft, die in der Qualifikation das starke Team von Kamerun eliminiert hatte, waren sechs Spieler integriert, die im Januar 1992 im Afrikanischen Nationenpokal eingesetzt worden waren. Aus diesem Grund durfte man das Olympiateam als recht erfahren bezeichnen, zumal im Vorfeld eine intensive Vorbereitung in Europa absolviert worden war.

Das Unentschieden gegen die Republik Korea bedeutete dann auch einen gelungenen Start in das Turnier; das (sehr) frühe Aus nach den nachfolgenden Niederlagen gegen Schweden und Paraguay mit sieben Verlusttoren passte ganz und gar nicht zu diesem von hohen Erwartungen geprägten Bild. Obwohl einzelne Spieler Talent verrieten und von Zeit zu Zeit auch einen schnellen Rhythmus durchzuhalten vermochten, waren es in der Schlussbetrachtung gerade individuelle Fehler, welche zum frühen Ausscheiden führten. Ebenso trug eine ausgeprägte Abschlusschwäche zu den eher enttäuschenden Leistungen bei. Das wurde ganz besonders beim abschliessenden Spiel gegen Paraguay deutlich, als individuelle Verteidigerfehler zu drei Verlusttoren führten und andererseits aus 23 Tormöglichkeiten nur ein einziges, und zwar in der Schlussminute, resultierte.

Taktisch war das Team bestrebt, sich der jeweiligen Situation anzupassen: vom 3-5-2 über 4-4-2 und 4-3-3 wurde alles versucht, doch besonders im Spiel gegen Schweden wurde offenbar, dass die Mannschaft diese taktischen Anpassungen nicht immer erfolgreich realisieren konnte. Die marinendeckende Verteidigung mit dem Einsatz eines zurückstaffelnden Liberos erhielt nur selten aus dem Mittelfeld die für die Ausdehnung der Verteidigungszone notwendige Unterstützung.

Im Angriff zeigte die Mannschaft eine Tendenz zu langsamem Kurzpassspiel oder Einzelaktionen, was nicht selten mit Ballverlust und Konterattacken endete. Besonders im Spiel gegen Paraguay wurden viele gute Möglichkeiten auf diese Weise vergeben, als die marokkanischen Stürmer in besten Abschlusspositionen nochmals einen Teamkollegen anschlagen wollten oder mit der Schussabgabe so lange zögerten, bis sie von gegnerischen Verteidigern neutralisiert wurden.

Achab stand in allen Spielen im Tor und zeigte mit Ausnahme eines verhängnisvollen Fehlers im Spiel gegen Paraguay eine ansprechende Leistung. Vor ihm spielten Bouhalal als Libero und die Innenvertei-

diger Moudakkar und Captain Naybet, der gegen Paraguay ein schönes Kopftor erzielte.

Als Außenverteidiger mit gelegentlichen Vorstößen in den Angriff agierten El Hadrioui und Abrami. Das Mittelfeld bestand in wechselnden Besetzungen, und das mag einer für die Gründe sein für die Probleme in der Teamorganisation und die mangelnde Unterstützung der Stürmer El Badraoui, Samadi und Rokbi. Der als Auswechselspieler eingesetzte Ahmed Bahja durfte zufrieden sein, erzielte er doch gegen Korea das einzige Tor für seine Mannschaft.

Ein weiterer Grund für die etwas enttäuschenden Leistungen der marokkanischen Mannschaft darf in der Tatze gesehen werden, dass sie zweimal gezwungen war, mehrstündige Busfahrten nach Barcelona und zurück in Kauf zu nehmen, was die Vorbereitung für die kommenden Spiele arg beeinträchtigte. Die Teilnahme am Olympischen Fussballturnier dient dieser Mannschaft, in der unzweifelhaft einiges Potential steckt, als willkommene Vorbereitung auf die bevorstehenden Spiele der Vorrunde des Weltcup 1994.

KUWAIT REACHED ITS TARGET

It was something of a surprise that Kuwait won through to the Olympic tournament at the qualifying competition in Malaysia in 1992. They edged out China, but only on goal difference. Getting this far was an achievement for them, and any further progress would have been just icing on the cake, as well as a chance to gather international experience.

When the groups were drawn, it was clear that while Kuwait would be rather an unknown quantity for their opponents, they themselves could hardly be expected to finish anywhere but in last place. This in fact happened, but despite their failure to earn even a single point and a goal line of 1-6, there were periods during their three games when they gave a good account of themselves.

Technically these players had been well trained, and on this account could stand comparison with any of their opponents. What proved their downfall was their inferior physical condition and their lack of international experience. Against the USA they dominated their opponents for the first half, took the lead and held on to it until the interval. But then their stamina ran out, and during the final 45 minutes the Americans turned the tables and scored three times.

Kuwait used all their players except the reserve goalkeeper. For the last match, when it was clear that they had been eliminated, their Brazilian coach Walmir Louruz used all the players who had not yet had a game, giving them a chance to show their skills against Italy, the Champions of Europe, and they in fact earned a respectable result.

The tactics their coach chose were very defensive. Knowing the strengths and limitations of his own players, he understandably opted for this formation, a style that was certainly not going to offer much for the spectators. On the defensive they used exclusively zone marking, but in midfield it was man to man. Although the defence often appeared to be overstretched at times, they managed to keep results within respectable limits. Their attacks were not frequent, especially when they began to show signs of tiredness, when they would scarcely get the ball out of the danger zone. In addition they had trouble applying the new rule, when a pass back to the goalkeeper would have been expected but now was not allowed. The Arabs had their best players in midfield. Al Khodari, Al-Ahmad and Salihi all looked good thanks to their skills and overview. But they too, like their colleagues, lacked penetration and speed off the mark. The forwards made little impression on opposing defences, and if danger did arise it was usually due to one of the midfielders.

Under the circumstances, Kuwait can be satisfied with their performance. Just to qualify was itself a success, considering the short time available for the Olympic team to prepare after the shattering events of the Gulf War.

De façon surprenante, l'équipe du Koweït avait réussi à se qualifier pour Barcelone, aux dépens de la Chine (même nombre de points, meilleure différence de buts) lors du tournoi décisif organisé en Malaisie. Son objectif était ainsi d'ores et déjà atteint, les matches du tournoi olympique ne constituant qu'un supplément devant permettre de s'aguerrir sur le plan international.

Compte-tenu de la composition du groupe, il était évident que le Koweït, une inconnue pour ses adversaires, ne pourrait pas éviter la dernière place. Ce qui s'est confirmé. Même si l'équipe a terminé avec zéro point et un goal-average de 1-6, elle a cependant réussi quelques bonnes choses au cours de ses trois matches.

Sur le plan technique, les joueurs du Koweït n'avaient rien à envier à personne. Ce qui a fait la différence par rapport aux équipes confirmées, c'est leur infériorité sur le plan physique et leur manque d'expérience internationale. Contre les États-Unis, le Koweït a contrôlé la situation pendant une mi-temps et il a même pris l'avantage à la marque. Mais il n'a pas tenu la distance physiquement et, après la pause, les Américains ont pris les choses en mains et ils ont renversé la situation en marquant trois fois.

Le Koweït a fait jouer tous les joueurs de son contingent, y compris ses gardiens remplaçants. Dans l'ultime match, alors que l'élimination ne pouvait plus être évitée, l'entraîneur brésilien Walmir Louruz a donné l'occasion à ses réservistes de faire la preuve de leur valeur en obtenant un résultat parfaitement honnorable contre les champions d'Europe italiens.

Tactiquement, le Koweït a évolué de façon très défensive. Selon l'entraîneur, ce sont les forces et les faiblesses de ses joueurs qui ont justifié ce choix, assez peu attractif pour le public. Les défenseurs ont pratiqué la défense de zone, alors que le marquage homme à homme était appliquée en milieu de terrain. La défense a souvent donné l'impression d'être débordée mais elle a généralement réussi à se tirer d'affaire et à éviter de lourdes défaites. Lorsque la fatigue commençait à se faire sentir, les Koweïtiens ont éprouvé de plus en plus de peine à sortir de leur zone. La nouvelle règle interdisant les passes en retrait au gardien constituait pour eux un handicap dans ces circonstances. C'est en milieu de terrain que les Arabes ont présenté leurs meilleurs éléments: Al Khodari, Al-Ahmad et Salihi se sont tous trois signalés par leur technique et leur vision du jeu. Comme à leurs coéquipiers, il leur a manqué la force de pénétration et la rapidité de mouvement. Les attaquants ont connu un échec presque total. Les quelques actions dangereuses devant le but adverse furent toutes l'œuvre des derniers.

Dans ces conditions, le Koweït peut être satisfait de son tournoi. Pour lui, la qualification pour Barcelone avait déjà été un succès, compte-tenu de la guerre du Golfe, qui n'avait laissé qu'un minimum de temps pour préparer la sélection nationale.

Kuwait logró clasificarse sorprendentemente a costa de China (mismo puntaje, mejor diferencia de goles) en la competición decisiva en Malasia para el Torneo Olímpico de Fútbol 1992. Con este paso había alcanzado su meta; los Juegos en Barcelona'92 eran meramente una participación pro forma para obtener experiencia internacional.

A base del agrupamiento, era obvio que Kuwait, pese a ser una escuadra desconocida para sus rivales, constituiría el furgón de cola del grupo. Este pronóstico se cumplió tal cual, pero hay que señalar que, a pesar de no puntear y

de ostentar un saldo negativo de 6 a 1 goles, la selección de Kuwait supo agradar en ciertas fases de sus tres partidos.

Los jugadores árabes eran técnicamente versados y, en este sector, no le iban en la zaga a ninguno de sus rivales. La diferencia residió en su estado físico insuficiente y la falta de experiencia internacional. Contra EEUU, Kuwait consiguió dominar el primer tiempo y pasar incluso adelante con un gol a cero hasta la pausa. Sin embargo, en los segundos 45 minutos les faltó fuerza, dando los americanos vuelta al tanteador con tres goles.

Con excepción del portero suplente, todos los jugadores tomaron parte en los enfrentamientos; principalmente en el último choque, cuando la eliminación kuwaití estaba ya decidida, su entrenador brasileño Walmir Louruz ofreció la posibilidad a los suplentes, que no habían aún jugado, a dar prueba de su habilidad contra el campeón europeo Italia.

El concepto táctico del entrenador fue jugar a la defensiva. Conociendo los pros y contras de sus jugadores, optó, comprensiblemente, por esta forma de jugar poco atrayente para los espectadores. En el bloque de contención se marcó en zona, mientras que en la línea media, los kuwaitis iban a la marcación personal. En varias ocasiones, la defensa dio muestra de mucha insolencia, pero consiguió evitar resultados más abultados gracias a su fortuna y espíritu de lucha. Particularmente, cuando comenzaban a desvanecer las fuerzas, los defensores tenían dificultades para salir de su zona de peligro. Asimismo, la regla que prohibía la devolución del balón al guardameta causó grandes problemas. Sus mejores jugadores operaban en la linea media. Al-Khodhari, Al-Ahmad y Saitan hicieron gala de fina técnica y buena visión de juego. Al igual que a sus compañeros, les faltó potencia luchadora y pique. El ataque estuvo prácticamente exento de dinamismo y fuerza de penetración. Los pocos momentos críticos ante la meta rival fueron producidos por los centrocampistas mencionados.

Bajo las presentes circunstancias, Kuwait puede estar satisfecho con su actuación, si se tiene en cuenta el corto periodo del que dispuso tras la guerra de 1990/91 para reunir una selección nacional olímpica.

Überraschenderweise gelang es der Mannschaft Kuwaits, sich auf Kosten Chinas (gleiche Punktzahl, besseres Torverhältnis) im entscheidenden Turnier in Malaysia für das Olympische Fussballturnier 1992 zu qualifizieren. Damit war das Ziel bereits erreicht, die Spiele in Barcelona waren nur noch Zugabe und dienten zur Erweiterung der internationalen Erfahrung.

Aufgrund der Gruppeneinteilung war zum vornherein klar, dass Kuwait, das zwar für seine Gegner eine unbekannte Größe war, kaum über den letzten Platz hinauskommen würde. Diese Voraussage traf dann auch ein, doch muss festgehalten werden, dass die Mannschaft trotz 0 Punkten und einem Torverhältnis von 1:6 in einzelnen Phasen der drei Spiele durchaus zu gefallen wusste.

Technisch waren die Spieler Kuwaits gut ausgebildet. Von diesen Möglichkeiten her gesehen mussten sie den Vergleich mit ihren Gegnern in keiner Weise scheuen. Was aber den Unterschied zu den

arrivierten Mannschaften ausmachte, waren die mangelhafte physische Verfassung und die fehlende internationale Erfahrung. Gegen die USA vermochte Kuwait eine Halbzeit lang den Gegner zu kontrollieren. Der arabische Vertreter ging sogar 1:0 in Führung und konnte diesen Vorsprung bis zur Pause halten. Die Kraft reichte dann jedoch nicht mehr für die zweiten 45 Minuten, in welchen die Amerikaner das Blatt noch wenden und drei Tore schiessen konnten.

Kuwait setzte bis auf den Ersatztorhüter sämtliche Spieler ein. Vor allem im letzten Spiel, als das Ausscheiden bereits feststand, gab der brasilianische Trainer Walmir Louruz den noch nicht zum Einsatz gekommenen Auswechselspielern Gelegenheit, ihr Können zu beweisen und gegen Europameister Italien zu einem ehrenvollen Resultat beizutragen.



Taktisch stellte der Trainer sein Team sehr defensiv ein. Um die Starken und Schwächen seiner Spieler wissend, wählte er aus verständlichen Gründen diese für die Zuschauer nicht sehr attraktive Spielweise. In der Defensive wurde durchwegs in der Zone gedeckt, hingegen spielten die Kuwaitis im Mittelfeld auf den Mann. Die Abwehr schien vielfach überfordert zu sein, doch gelang es dank Glück und Können, zu brutale Resultate abzuwenden.

Vor allem wenn jeweils die Kräfte nachliessen hatten die Akteure Mühe, sich aus der eigenen Gefahrenzone zu befreien. Zudem kam ihnen die neue Regel in den Phasen nicht entgegen, in welchen jeweils ein Rückpass zum Torhüter angesagt gewesen wäre. Im Mittelfeld hatten die Araber ihre besten Spieler.

Al Khodhari, Al-Ahmad und Saihan gefielen durch eine ausgefeilte Technik und gute Übersicht. Ihnen mangelte es aber, wie ihren Teamkollegen auch, an der fehlenden Durchschlagskraft und Antrittsschnelligkeit. Der Sturm war fast gänzlich ohne Durchsetzungsvermögen.

Entstand einmal Gefahr vor dem gegnerischen Tor, waren meist die erwähnten Mittelfeldspieler die Autoren solcher Situationen.

Kuwait darf unter den gegebenen Umständen mit seinem Abschneiden zufrieden sein. Bereits die Qualifikation war ein Erfolg, wenn man bedenkt, in welch kurzer Zeit die Olympiamannschaft nach den Kriegswirren der Jahre 1990/91 zusammengestellt werden musste.

Kuwait had already achieved their ambitions by qualifying for Barcelona. Despite three clear defeats, the individual skills they showed (here Ahmed Haji against Italy) were well appreciated at the Olympic tournament.

En se qualifiant pour Barcelone, le Kuweit avait déjà atteint son but. Les trois sévères défaites subies lors du tournoi olympique furent quelque peu atténuées par les performances de plusieurs de ses joueurs (sur l'image: Ahmed Haji lors du match contre l'Italie).

Kuwait había alcanzado su meta con la simple clasificación para el torneo en Barcelona. Pese a las tres claras derrotas sufridas, algunos jugadores demostraron su habilidad personal (en la foto: Ahmed Haji contra Italia).

Kuwait hatte sein Ziel bereits mit der Qualifikation für Barcelona erreicht. Durch individuelles Können (im Bild Ahmed Haji gegen Italien) wusste es trotz drei deutlichen Niederlagen auch am Olympiaturnier zu fallen.

MEDICAL OBSERVATIONS

At the XXVth Olympic Games, a study was carried out on the injuries suffered during the football tournament. The results were as follows:

Not surprisingly, most of the injuries (85%) concerned the lower extremities, predominantly knee and foot, and 15% other parts of the body. 70% per cent of the injuries were of a serious nature, the other 30% relatively minor, due to overload on muscles and joints.

Very few of the injuries involved ligaments or muscle insertions (entesitis), and this is connected with the fact that none of the players were over 23 years old, as demanded by the regulations.

We point this out because normally older players are the ones to suffer from damaged ligaments, while for younger ones muscle insertion problems are more common.

Of the injuries to joints:
7% were damage to meniscus-side knee ligaments 15% damage to ankle ligaments; mostly injuries to the outer ligaments sustained during backward motion.

95% of the muscle injuries were rated as light or medium, such as cramps, bruises or pulled muscles. The other 5% were serious muscle ruptures.

The number of the injuries occurred during training was 7. During the competition, however, this figure rose to 17, most likely a consequence of the extra effort the players made; this was evident during the whole tournament and probably led in many cases to players' forgetting the well-intentioned warnings and cautions given to them by their technical advisers.

Durant le tournoi de football des XXVes Jeux Olympiques de Barcelone, nous avons procédé à une étude destinée à établir le bilan des blessures propres à la pratique du football. Nous en avons résumé les résultats sous forme de statistiques.

En premier lieu et en toute logique, le 85% des lésions se sont localisées aux extrémités inférieures, entre le genou et le pied. Le reste touchait les autres parties du corps. Le 70% furent des lésions aiguës et le 30% des blessures de fatigue dues à une surcharge des muscles et des articulations.

Il convient de mettre en exergue le petit nombre de lésions ligamentaires et d'entorses enregistrées, ce qui provient du fait que les joueurs qui entrent dans nos statistiques étaient tous âgés de moins de 23 ans compte tenu de la limite d'âge du tournoi.

Nos observations confirment que les lésions ligamentaires touchent surtout les joueurs les plus âgés alors que les plus jeunes en restent au stade de l'entorse.

Les lésions articulaires furent:

7% de lésions ménisque/ligaments du genou, 15% de lésions ligamentaires de la cheville, parmi lesquelles une majorité de déchirures touchant les ligaments externes.

Le 95% des lésions musculaires furent des lésions moyennes ou légères (contractures, contusions, déchirures ligamentaires). Le 5% seulement furent des ruptures diagnostiquées comme graves.

Le nombre des blessures à l'entraînement fut de 7. En compétition, ce chiffre a passé à 17, un chiffre qui s'explique par l'ardeur de joueurs qui, dans le feu de l'action, oublient les précautions et les recommandations qui leur sont enseignées à l'entraînement.



Tough duels, but no serious injuries; a very satisfying balance from the medical point of view.

La rencontre qui a opposé la Suède à l'Australie fut intensive mais les joueurs n'ont jamais oublié la règle d'or du sport, à savoir le respect de l'adversaire.

Durante el Torneo de Fútbol con ocasión de los XXV Juegos Olímpicos de Barcelona hemos hecho un estudio con un balance lesional en lo que se refiere al apartado del fútbol. Les ofrecemos en forma de resumen los resultados estadísticos.

En primer lugar, y como es lógico suponer, el 85% de las lesiones han estado localizadas en la extremidad inferior, en el segmento rodilla-pie; el 15% en el resto del organismo. El 70% eran lesiones agudas y el 30% por sobrecarga siendo éstas fundamentalmente musculares y articulares.

Hemos de recalcar la mínima incidencia de lesiones tendinosas y de inserción (entesitis) que han sufrido los jugadores de nuestro deporte, teniendo en cuenta que la muestra analizada se trataba de jugadores los cuales no podían sobrepasar la edad de 23 años. Recalcamos esta observación ya que las lesiones tendinosas aparecen en jugadores veteranos y las de inserción en más jóvenes.

De las lesiones articulares eran:

Un 7% lesiones menisco-ligamentosas de rodilla. Un 15% lesiones ligamentosas de tobillo y dentro de estas el mayor porcentaje corresponde a lesiones en supinación, por tanto, con afectación del ligamento lateral externo.

El 95% de las lesiones musculares han sido consideradas como lesiones medianas ó leves, y entre estas destacamos las contracturas, las contusiones y las rupturas fibrilares. El 5% restante fueron rupturas de mayor importancia.

El número de lesiones en entrenamientos fue 7 y sin embargo, la competición presentaba un índice lesional mayor, subiendo la cifra hasta 17. Esto es explicable por la mayor fogosidad puesta por los jugadores en los partidos, olvidando precauciones e indicaciones de los técnicos en entrenamientos.

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Während dem Fussballturnier anlässlich der XXV Olympischen Spiele wurde eine Studie bezüglich Sportverletzungen im Fussball mit folgenden Resultaten erstellt:

Wie nicht anders zu erwarten, betrafen 85% aller Verletzungen die unteren Extremitäten, vor allem die Bereiche Knie/Füsse, 15% den restlichen Organismus. 70% der Verletzungen mussten als gravierend bezeichnet werden und 30% waren leichtere Verletzungen, hervorgerufen aus Überbelastung von Muskeln und Gelenken.

Die wenigsten der Verletzungen betrafen Schädigungen der Sehnen oder Muskelansätze (Entesitis). Das kann darauf zurückgeführt werden, dass aufgrund der Alterslimite kein Akteur unseres Sports älter als 23 Jahre war. Wir weisen deshalb auf diesen Umstand hin, weil normalerweise Sehnenverletzungen bei älteren, Schädigungen am Muskelansatz bei jüngeren Spielern häufig vorkommen.

Von den Gelenkverletzungen waren:

7% Schädigungen der meniskusseitigen Kniebänder, 15% Verletzungen der Bänder im Knöchelbereich; die meisten auf den Außenbändern, entstanden nach Bewegungen in Rücklage.

95% der Muskelverletzungen konnten als mittelschwer oder leicht eingestuft werden und äusserten sich in Form von Krämpfen, Prellungen und Muskelfaserrissen. Die restlichen 5% betrafen schwerwiegendere Muskelfaserrisse.

Sieben aller Verletzungen entstanden während des Trainings. Im Wettkampf stieg diese Zahl allerdings auf 17 an - wohl eine Folge des generösen Einsatzes, der das ganze Turnier geprägt hat und viele Spieler die gutgemeinten Warnungen und Empfehlungen der technischen Betreuer vergessen liess.



THE REFEREES AND LINESMEN

The FIFA Referees' Committee has, for the first time ever, called on specialised linesmen as well as referees to officiate at an international competition.

The refereeing group for the tournament was made up of 14 referees and 14 linesmen from 28 different countries, divided between the venues in Barcelona, Valencia and Zaragoza. At the venues the officials had the opportunity to continue their daily training and technical discussions after the matches. There was excellent co-operation among the referees and linesmen despite various nationalities and the general performance was exceptionally high, proving this experiment to be most encouraging.

The referees underwent a physical fitness test prior to the tournament, the results of which were very good. The very low average age (38) could also account for the high results.

The technical performance of the referees was positive, especially as regards the application of the new rules, which were also well understood by players and coaches

alike. The latter had received additional information prior to the tournament. The theoretical preparation was concentrated on the new rules, particularly the back-pass to the goalkeeper. There were in fact only two occasions upon which the referees showed any uncertainty concerning the application of the new rules. It was evident that the new rules had a positive influence on the matches, making them more fluent and causing less loss of time. The new rules did not cause any confusion, nor did they interfere with the defenders' play.

From a disciplinary point of view, the tournament reflected an image of fair play which could be regarded as exceptional when taking the different technical and geographical backgrounds into account.

In conclusion, it can be said that a group of young, physically well-prepared FIFA referees is on the up and coming, to whom a more specified technical and theoretical preparation should be transmitted.

Grande première: la Commission des Arbitres de la FIFA a procédé à la nomination des juges de touche spécialisés qui secondaient les arbitres lors du Tournoi Olympique de Barcelone.

Le groupe des directeurs de jeu du tournoi était composé de 14 arbitres et de 14 juges de touche de 28 pays différents. Ils ont été répartis entre les centres de Barcelone, Valencia et Saragosse. Dans ces centres, ils avaient la possibilité de poursuivre leur entraînement quotidiens et leurs discussions techniques après les matches. En dépit de la diversité des nationalités, la coopération entre les arbitres et les juges de touche fut excellente. Le niveau général de l'arbitrage fut exceptionnellement haut, ce qui indique que l'expérience doit être encouragée.

Les arbitres ont subi un test physique avant le tournoi. Les résultats furent très bons. La moyenne d'âge très basse (38 ans) y est pour beaucoup.

La performance technique du corps arbitral fut positive, spécialement en regard de l'application des nouvelles règles, qui ont été bien comprises par les joueurs comme par les entraîneurs. La préparation technique avait d'ailleurs été concentrée sur les nouvelles règles, particulièrement sur la passe en retrait au gardien. En fait, l'application de la nouvelle règle n'a posé problème aux arbitres qu'en deux occasions seulement. Il est évident que les nouvelles règles ont influencé positivement le déroulement des matches, rendant le jeu plus fluide et limitant les pertes de temps. Les nouvelles règles n'ont créé aucune confusion, que ce soit chez les arbitres ou chez les défenseurs.

En ce qui concerne la discipline, le tournoi a été placé sous le signe d'un fairplay que l'on peut qualifier d'exceptionnel si l'on tient compte des différences techniques et géographiques qui constituaient sa toile de fond.

En conclusion, nous pouvons dire que nous disposons d'un groupe de jeunes arbitres FIFA parfaitement préparés physiquement et qui sont à même désormais de pouvoir bénéficier d'une préparation technique et théorique plus spécifique.

Por primera vez, la Comisión de Arbitros de la FIFA ha designado no sólo árbitros especializados, sino también jueces de línea.

El grupo de árbitros para el Torneo Olímpico de Fútbol estuvo formado por 14 árbitros y 14 jueces de línea de 28 países diferentes, repartidos en las sedes de Barcelona, Valencia y Zaragoza. En cada subsede, los colegiados estuvieron en condición de entrenarse diariamente y de llevar a cabo sus discusiones técnicas tras cada partido. La cooperación entre árbitros y jueces de línea fue excelente, pese a las diferentes nacionalidades, siendo, asimismo, la actuación general excepcionalmente buena, lo cual hace que este experimento sea muy prometedor.

Los árbitros se tuvieron que someter a una prueba de condición física antes del Torneo, siendo los resultados muy buenos. El promedio de edad bajo (38 años) fue, seguramente, una de las razones para estos rendimientos tan altos.

La actuación técnica de los árbitros fue positiva, particularmente en lo que concierne la aplicación de las nuevas reglas, siendo perfectamente comprendidas igualmente por los jugadores y entrenadores. Estos últimos habían recibido informaciones adicionales al respecto antes del comienzo del Torneo. La preparación teórica se concentró en las nuevas reglas, especialmente en la devolución del pase al guardameta.

Hubo únicamente dos situaciones en las cuales el árbitro correspondiente manifestó cierta inseguridad en cuanto a la aplicación de las nuevas reglas. Fue evidente que las nuevas reglas tuvieron una influencia positiva sobre el desarrollo de los partidos, haciendo que el juego sea



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más fluido y evitando la pérdida de tiempo. Las nuevas reglas no causaron confusiones ni produjeron interferencias en el juego de los defensores.

Desde el punto de vista disciplinario, el Torneo se desarrolló en un ambiente de juego leal ejemplar y excepcional si se tienen en cuenta las diferentes técnicas y procedencias geográficas.

En resumen, se puede afirmar que está emergiendo un grupo de jóvenes árbitros de la FIFA, físicamente bien preparados, que necesitan todavía un ligero perfeccionamiento a nivel técnico y teórico.

Die Schiedsrichterkommission der FIFA hatte erstmals für einen internationalen Wettbewerb nicht nur Schiedsrichter, sondern auch spezialisierte Linienrichter nominiert.

Das Aufgebot bestand aus 14 Schieds- und 14 Linienrichtern aus 28 Ländern, die auf die Austragungsorte Barcelona, Valencia und Saragossa verteilt wurden. An diesen Orten konnten täglich Trainings und, nach den Spielen, technische Diskussionsrunden organisiert werden, wobei bestätigt wurde, dass trotz unterschiedlichster Nationalitäten die Zusammenarbeit zwischen Schieds- und Linienrichtern ausgezeichnet war und auf einem hohen Leistungsniveau stand. Diese Tatsache allein machte das Experiment zu einem ermutigenden Erfolg.

Vor dem ersten Einsatz hatten sich die Spielleiter einem Fitnesstest zu unterziehen. Die allgemein guten Resultate dieses Tests sind wohl auf das niedrige Durchschnittsalter (38 Jahre) zurückzuführen.

Fachlich zeigten alle Schiedsrichter positive Leistungen, speziell was das Verständnis der neu eingeführten Regeln betraf, die im übrigen auch von den Spielern und den Trainern gut adaptiert wurden, wobei die letzteren vor dem Turnier noch speziell instruiert worden waren. Das Schwergewicht der Information lag auf der Erklärung der Rückpassregel an den Torhütern und es wurden dann auch nur zwei Fälle beobachtet, in denen Schiedsrichter Szenen Unsicherheiten in der Regeldeutung zeigten. Die neuen Regeln beeinflussten das Spiel in dem Sinne positiv, als der Spielfluss erhöht und weniger Zeit verschwendet wurde. Es wurden keinerlei Konfusionen, auch nicht im Bereich der Verteidigungsarbeit, festgestellt.

Das disziplinarische Verhalten an diesem Turnier darf angesichts der Vielzahl technischer und geographischer Hintergründe der Spieler als außergewöhnlich gut beurteilt werden.

Abschließend kann gesagt werden, dass mit einer Gruppe von jungen, physisch bestausgebildeten Schiedsrichtern, die noch mit den spezifischen technischen und theoretischen Informationen versorgt werden soll, eine neue Generation von Topklasse-Spielleitern heranreift.

FAIR PLAY: SWEDEN ON TOP

Thanks to only two yellow cards in four games, and their sporting behaviour both on and off the pitch, Sweden came out top in the fair play evaluation. This was something of a surprise, since in recent years the award has always gone to a team reaching the semi-finals (bonus points for getting into the last four). FIFA would like to congratulate the Swedish team and the Swedish Association on this fine achievement.

In general, it was a very fair tournament. Despite the "flood" of 105 yellow and 15 red cards, which were due to the referees following their mandate of adhering strictly to the rules, the players were largely correct in their actions and showed due respect for their opponents. None of the injuries sustained was the result of hard play on the part of one of the players. The only serious casualties (Sweden's Brolin and Australia's Murphy) were the result of unlucky collisions.

La Suède a reçu le Prix du Fairplay pour n'avoir écopé que de deux cartons jaunes en quatre matches et grâce aussi à son comportement sportif sur et en dehors du terrain de jeu. Un résultat qui a surpris car, auparavant, le lauréat avait toujours été une équipe qualifiée pour les demi-finales (avec le bonus accordé pour la qualification). La FIFA félicite l'équipe suédoise ainsi que la Fédération suédoise pour ce succès.

Dans l'ensemble, ce tournoi olympique a été très correct. L'avalanche de carton jaunes (105) et de cartons rouges (15) qui a été enregistrée provient avant tout des consignes de strict respect des règlements données aux arbitres. Dans l'ensemble, les matches se sont joués sous le signe de la correction et du respect de l'adversaire. Le jeu dur n'est à l'origine d'aucune blessure grave.

Les seules blessures sérieuses (le Suédois Brolin et l'Australien Murphy) sont dues à de malencontreux téléscopages dans le cours du jeu.

Gracias a dos tarjetas amarillas únicamente y a su conducta deportiva ejemplar tanto en el terreno de juego como fuera del mismo, Suecia se clasificó primera en el certamen de Fair-Play. Esto fue algo sorprendente, ya que en los últimos años ganaban generalmente equipos que se clasificaban para las semifinales (puntos adicionales por la clasificación para las semifinales). La FIFA felicita a la selección sueca y a su asociación nacional por este éxito.

En general, se puede hablar de un Torneo muy deportivo. A pesar del raudal de 105 tarjetas amarillas y 15 rojas, lo cual se puede explicar con la instrucción a los árbitros de imponer estrictamente las Reglas, se jugó en forma correcta y se respetó al adversario. Keine Verletzungen kamen infolge der harten Gangart einzelner Spieler zustande. Die einzigen gravierenden Blessuren (Schwedens Brolin und Australiens Murphy) waren auf unglückliche Zusammenstöße zurückzuführen.
